Certificate of Achievement (CA)

Dietary Manager (Dietetic Service Supervisor)

19 units

Qualifies you to be hired as a Dietetic Service Supervisor and prepares you to sit the National Certified Dietary Manager (CDM) exam. Pass the CDM exam and you can be hired as a Certified Dietary Manager.



Associate in Science Degree (AS)

Dietetic Technology (DT)

60 units

AS Attainment qualifies students to receive the Verification Statement from the Program Director and they are then eligible to sit for the national exam to become a Dietetic Technician, Registered (DTR).



Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T)

Nutrition & Dietetics

60 units

An Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) is a two-year degree that prepares California Community College students to transfer to a California State University (CSU).

Enjoy a competitive salary and strong career growth in hospitals, nursing facilities, schools, and community health programs.

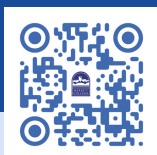

This program typically takes 2.5 years to complete, and includes a three-semester internship.

Dietetic Technicians work alongside Registered Dietitians in healthcare settings. They handle nutrition screening, dietary education, food service, and menu modifications, making them vital members of the healthcare and food service management teams.
